

Stop 1/3. Zhevakhova Gora

This high cape dividing Khadzhibeisky and Kuyalnitsky Limans on the high bank of the northern part of Odessa Bay contains a series of archaeological monuments and single finds of different periods. Most of them (a Late Bronze Age barrow, two diachronic barrows, a settlement of the 2nd - beginning of the 5th century CE) have only been located without further investigations. Other finds are represented by scarce numismatics, among which Roman coins (a denarium of Antonin Pius II and a copper coin of Theodosius minted in Nikomedia in the 4th century BCE) and a silver eastern coin were discovered (Fabritsius, 1951; Diamant and Kuzmenko, 1978).

The settlement of the 5th-3rd century BCE that was discovered and studied by Mikhail Sinitsyn (1955) in the 1950s and 1960s is widely known. He uncovered houses, a pit for grain storage, red-figure vessels, and other objects. In 2006, fieldwork at this settlement resumed.
